

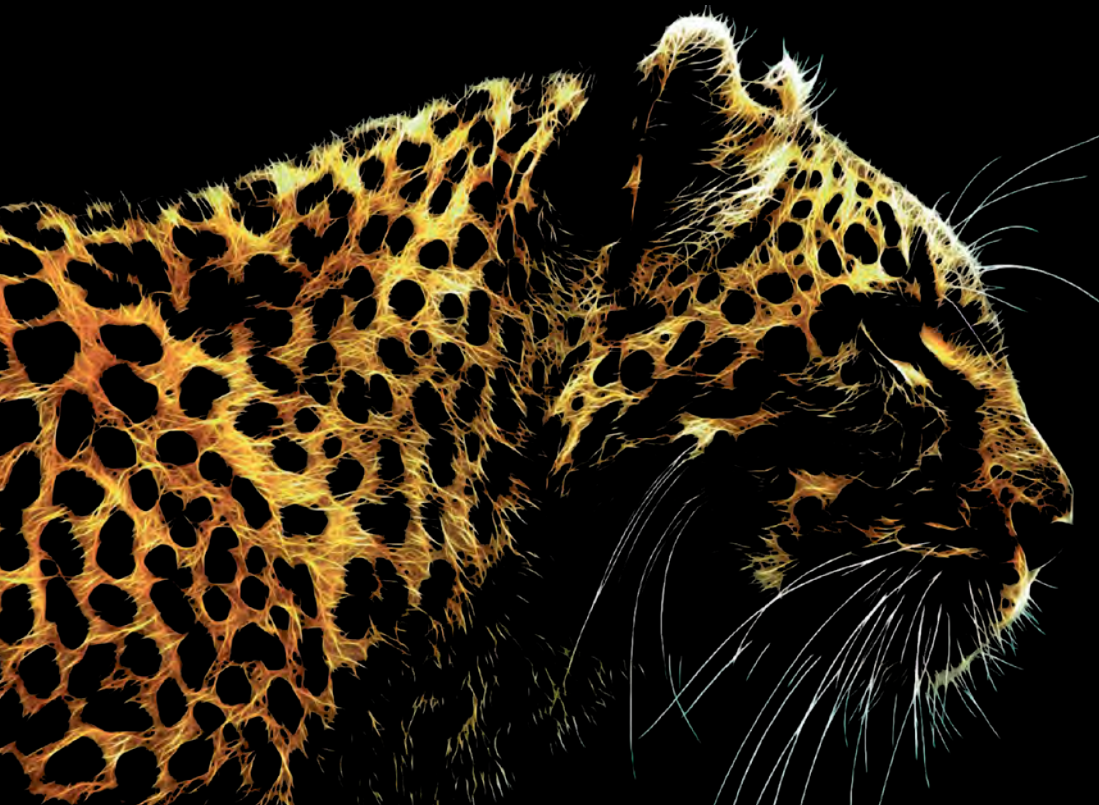

Species available on quota for hunting: Blesbuck, Blue Wildebeest, Bushpig, Cape Buffalo, Eland, Giraffe, Impala, Kudu (Southern Greater), Mountain Reedbuck, Red Hartebeest, Waterbuck, Zebra (Burchell's).
(Bushbuck, Common Duiker, Crocodile, Elephant, Hippo, Leopard, Springbuck and Warthog are also on the Reserve).

Nooitgedacht Dam Nature Reserve

Species available on quota for hunting: Black Wildebeest, Blesbuck, Common Reedbuck, Red Hartebeest, Springbuck.
(Cape Buffalo, Oribi and Zebra (Burchell's) are also on the Reserve)

Timbavati & Klaserie Private Nature Reserves

Songimvelo Nature Reserve

South Africa's largest provincial Nature Reserve



Transfrontier Park with World Heritage status

Songimvelo Nature Reserve is South Africa's largest Provincial Nature Reserve and forms part of the Songimvelo-Malolotja Transfrontier Conservation area, a peace park located south of Barberton, in the south-eastern part of the Mpumalanga Province on the South African - Swaziland border.

The incredible beauty of its range of mountains, which forms one of the oldest regions on earth, with incredible volcanic and sedimentary rocks, examples of which are exceeded only by those found in Greenland. Rolling hills, hidden valleys, wide open plains and forest ravines support an incredible diversity of wildlife, plants and habitats. Along the valley floor winds the Komati River, after which it flows into Swaziland and to the Indian Ocean.

The grassy plains of Songimvelo Nature Reserve are home to herds of Buffalo, Blesbuck, Blue Wildebeest, Bushpig, Eland, Impala, Red Hartebeest and Zebra whilst within the wooded and hillside areas one will find Bushbuck, Giraffe, Kudu, Mountain Reedbuck and Elephant.

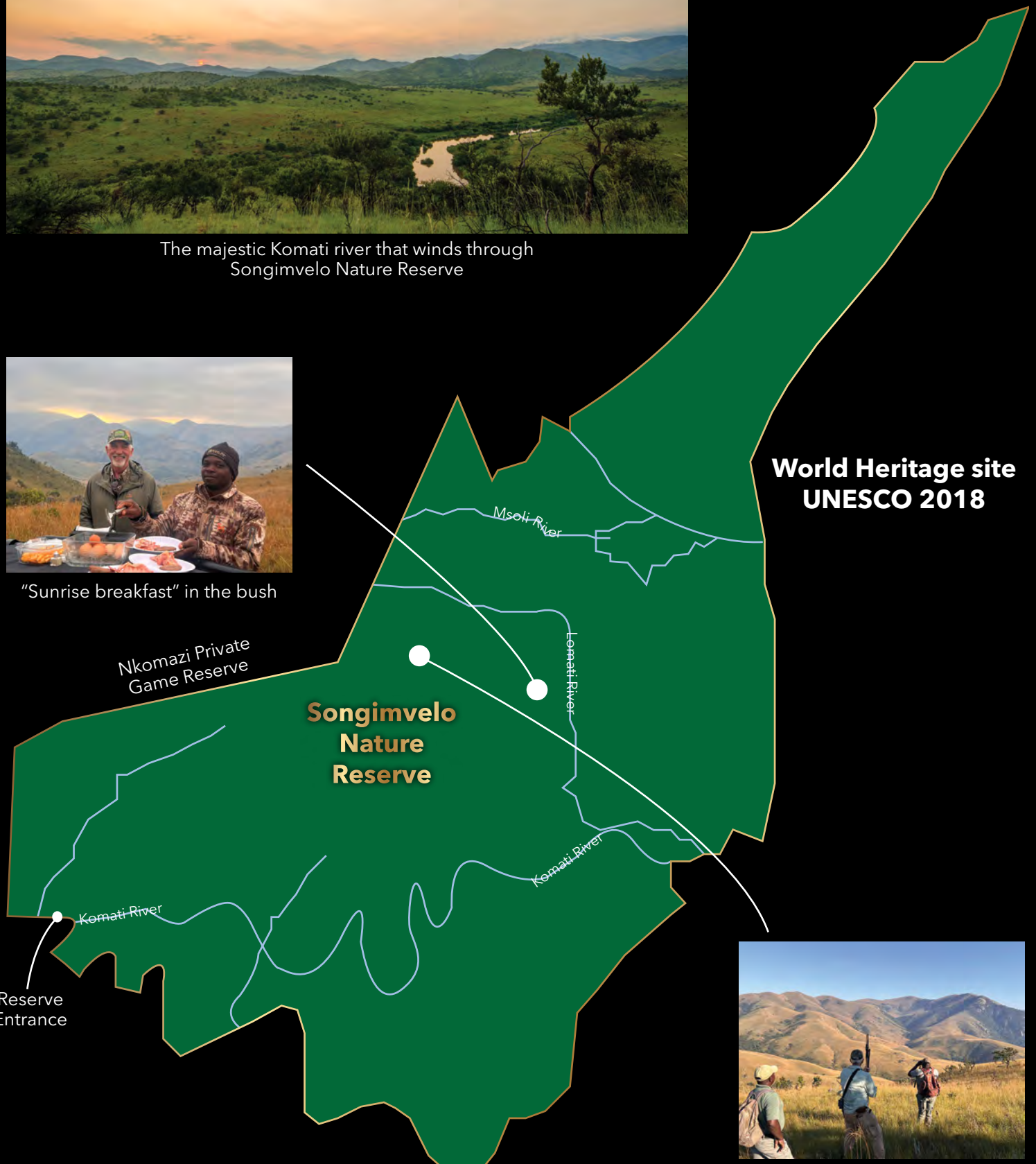

Barberton Makhonjwa Mountains WORLD HERITAGE SITE



Barberton Makhonjwa Mountains World Heritage Site received inscription in July 2018 at the 42nd Session of the UNESCO World Heritage Committee held in the Kingdom of Bahrain in Manama. An area of about 115 137 ha was inscribed with land ownership including State; private/corporate; Communal Trusts and CPA's (Communal Property Association) Outstanding Universal Value (OUV) which the site portrays:

- The rocks that are found at this site demonstrates an Archaean stage of Earth's history, including the earliest record of life forms as well as the earliest and most significant geomorphic and physiographic features being the result of processes in the development of the planet's ocean, atmosphere, an landforms.
- The site provides a 340 million year old window into the early Earth, right at the time life began. Physical evidence of first life forms has been found in these rocks with some of it so clear it can be seen with the naked eye.
- Current geological sites included on the World Heritage List are not comparable to any other in the World Granite greenstone belts are significant features that are not represented among any properties currently inscribed on the World Heritage List under criterion (viii).
- Criterion include outstanding examples representing major stages of earth's history including the record of life, significant on-going geological processes in the development of landforms, or significant geomorphic or physiographic features.

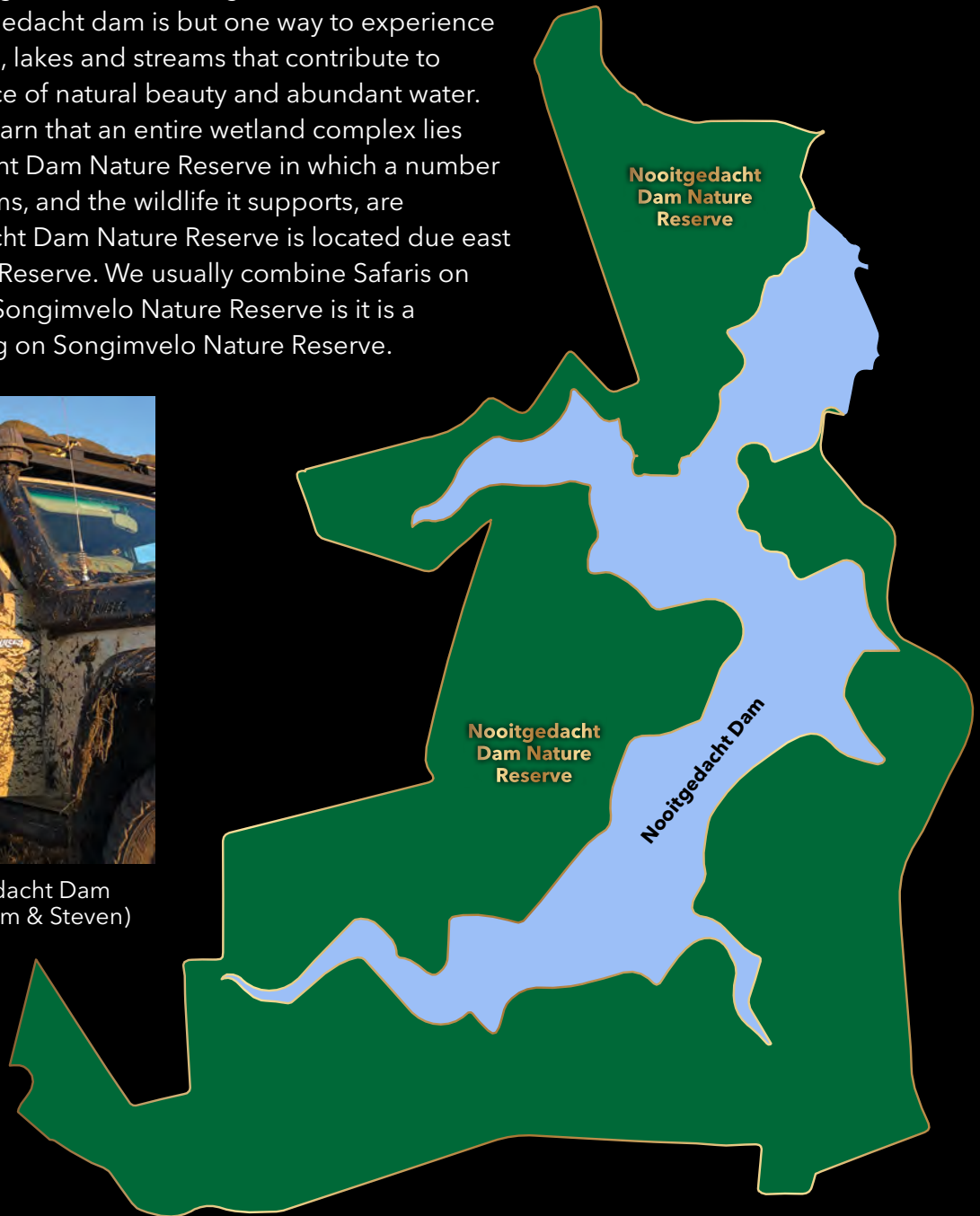

NOOITGEDACHT DAM NATURE RESERVE

This part of Mpumalanga is known as the grass and wetlands region, and the Nooitgedacht dam is but one way to experience the myriad water spots, lakes and streams that contribute to making this area a place of natural beauty and abundant water. It is not surprising to learn that an entire wetland complex lies within the Nooitgedacht Dam Nature Reserve in which a number of important ecosystems, and the wildlife it supports, are protected. Nooitgedacht Dam Nature Reserve is located due east of Songimvelo Nature Reserve. We usually combine Safaris on NDNR with Safaris on Songimvelo Nature Reserve as it is a "day trip" while hunting on Songimvelo Nature Reserve.

The Nooitgedacht Dam Nature Reserve is also one of MTPA's (Mpumalanga Tourism and Parks Agency) Nature Reserves. The Reserve which surrounds the Nooitgedacht dam is in the Highveld of the Mpumalanga Province and approximately 10 miles northwest of the small town of Carolina. The Reserve is a quick drive in a south-westerly direction from Songimvelo Nature Reserve.

Numerous game species are to be found in the Reserve, Black Wildebeest, Blesbuck, Cape Buffalo, Common Reedbuck, Oribi, Red Hartebeest, Springbuck and Zebra. The Reserve surrounds the Nooitgedacht dam where the Komati River originates, which from there flows down to Songimvelo Nature Reserve. Other important tributaries are the Boesmanspruit, Witkloofspruit and the Vaalwaterspruit.

Logistics:

Nooitgedacht Dam Nature Reserve is located about 1½ hour drive southwest from Songimvelo Nature Reserve. If our clients are interested in any of the species on Nooitgedacht Dam Nature Reserve we do a day trip to the Reserve.

Timbavati Private Nature Reserve

True Africa where Africa's "dangerous 7" roams free

The Timbavati Private Nature Reserve forms part of the "Greater Park" area, which allows free movement of game across 432 000 acres of land. The area is made up of Mopani bushveld, Acacia shrub, watering holes and riverbeds that attract a huge variety of game including Buffalo, Black Rhino, Blue Wildebeest, Elephant, Giraffe, Hippo, Impala, Kudu, White Rhino, Waterbuck, Zebra and several other antelope species. These in turn attract a number of predators, such as Lion, Leopard, Cheetah and Hyena, which makes this a popular choice for a traditional African Safari.

Our clients will experience a free range Safari. Our tented Safari camp is located on the banks of the Nhlalalumi river which adds to the true African Safari experience that we offer.

- Country:** South Africa.
- Location:** Mpumalanga Province.
- Elevation:** 1,745 feet above sea level.
- Area size:** 130,965 acres.
- Logistics:** A connecting flight from Johannesburg (OR Tambo International Airport) to Hoedspruit (Eastgate Airport) is required. Please discuss the return flight options with our offices as one might change to a different area after being successful in the Timbavati.
- Camp:** Our traditional tented Safari camp (4 tents) is located on the banks of the Nhlaralumi river. Each tent has an en-suite bathroom with hot and cold running water. Our "dining area" is around the campfire.
- Electricity:** Our camp runs on solar power. 220 V electricity available at our headquarters which is a 40 minute drive from Safari camp. Devices can either be charged at the headquarters at night or in our vehicles during the day. We suggest you bring a converter for voltage differences as we are 220 Volt. Most modern-day chargers accept 110 – 220 Volts. Please check that yours does comply or else you will need to bring a converter from 220 Volts to 110 Volts. Please bring a multi plug adaptor along to avoid inconvenience.
- Wi-Fi:** Only at our headquarters during the day. (45-minutes' drive from camp)
Satellite wi-fi available in camp at \$20 per day.

- Hunting season:** 1 April of the current year through end of March the following year.
- Hunting permit:** We will apply for the necessary hunting permit in your name. Each hunter needs a hunting permit (our offices need to know exactly what species each hunter is interested in hunting for us to be able to apply for each individual specie in the hunter's name).
- Species available for hunting:** Cape Buffalo bulls, Cape Buffalo cows, Elephant, Hippo, Hyena and a Plains Game package (1 x Blue Wildebeest, 1 x Giraffe, 1 x Impala, 1 x Kudu, 1 x Warthog, 1 x Waterbuck and 1 x Zebra)
- Typical hunting day:** Wake up will be about an hour to half an hour before sunrise (month dependent). We usually have a warm breakfast of choice and will head out immediately thereafter. In general, due to the vastness of the area we take a packed lunch with us and enjoy the lunch break either in a dry riverbed or in the shade of a big "Nyala berry" tree (on occasion we will return to camp for lunch). After lunch we will continue with the afternoon hunt. We will head back to camp at around, or just after sunset. Once in camp a hot shower is usually in order of the day after which we will meet around the campfire for a warm hearty dinner.
- Taxidermist:** Life Form Taxidermy will collect all our trophies after every two month period (depending on the number of trophies). Life Form Taxidermy will be in contact with you once the trophies have been checked in on their end.

As the map indicates, the Timbavati Private Nature Reserve forms part of the "Greater Park" (green area). There are NO fences that separate these areas (Klasierie, Timbavati, Umbabat) and all animals roam freely between the 4 reserves, which makes this one of the most pristine "Dangerous Game" hunting blocks in South Africa today where one can see between a 1,000 to 2,000 Buffalo during a 7 - day Safari.

Tshipise Reserve

.....home of four of Africa's Big Five.....



Tshipise Reserve is privately owned and managed since 1974 by a family who is passionate about Africa and its wildlife and who are pioneers in the South African conservation industry. The reserve is in excess of 55,000 acres of continuous wild Africa which is home to four of Africa's Big 5 (Buffalo, Elephant, Leopard and White & Black Rhino) and is carefully managed to ensure that the reserve maintains its natural ecological integrity. With Mopane and Acacia shrub, huge mountains, massive Baobab trees, dry riverbeds, with open plains areas that has more than 8,000 head of game. Tshipise Reserve is without a doubt one of Southern Africa's prime conservation areas.

General information - Tshipise Reserve

- Country:** South Africa.
- Location:** Limpopo province (Northeast).
- Elevation:** 1,800 feet above sea level.
- Area size:** 55,000 acres.
- Logistics:** A connecting flight from Johannesburg (OR Tambo International Airport) is required on your "arrival day" (as per your Safari contract) to Hoedspruit (Eastgate Airport) or Polokwane International Airport and back to Johannesburg from Hoedspruit or Polokwane International Airport on the day of departure. On occasion we change areas during a Safari thus the Safari may end in a different location than originally planned. If this is a possibility for your Safari please confirm with Graham where the alternative airport for your departure flight to Johannesburg would be.
- Camp:** Our Safari camp is designed for privacy and comprises of 5 double rooms, all with en-suite bathrooms, electricity, and all necessary amenities. Our guests will enjoy 5-star cuisine either in the central dining area or around the campfire at night. Our camp also offers a beautifully appointed open lounge area where you can relax.
- Electricity:** Our camp runs on local 220 V power. (Two and three point plugs available in each room / tent). Most modern-day chargers accept 110 - 220 Volts. Please check that yours does comply or else you will need to bring a converter from 220 Volts to 110 Volts. Please bring a multi plug adaptor with to avoid inconvenience. Devices can be charged in camp or in our vehicles during the day.

- Hunting season:** On Tshipise Reserve we can hunt year around but in general hunting season starts from 1 April to 31 October.
- Hunting method:** Rifle, Bow and Handgun.
- Species available for hunting:** Baboon, Black-backed Jackal, Blue Wildebeest, Cape Buffalo, Common Duiker, Eland, Gemsbok, Giraffe, Kudu (Southern Greater), Impala, Klipspringer, Nyala, Red Hartebeest, Roan Antelope, Sable Antelope, Steenbuck, Tsessebe, Warthog, Waterbuck and Zebra (Burchell's and Hartmann's).
- Typical hunting day:** Wake up will be about half an hour before sunrise. We usually have a warm breakfast of choice and will head out immediately thereafter. We will then return to camp for lunch and take a short break till we head out for the afternoon hunt. We will head back to camp at around, or just after sunset. Once in camp a hot shower is usually in order of the day after which we will meet around the campfire for a warm hearty dinner.
- Taxidermist:** Life Form Taxidermy will collect all trophies at the end of every two-month period (depending on the number of trophies). Life Form will be in contact with you once your trophies have been received and checked in at their facilities. Life Form Taxidermy is in White River - a 30-minute drive (North) from our offices which are in Nelspruit.

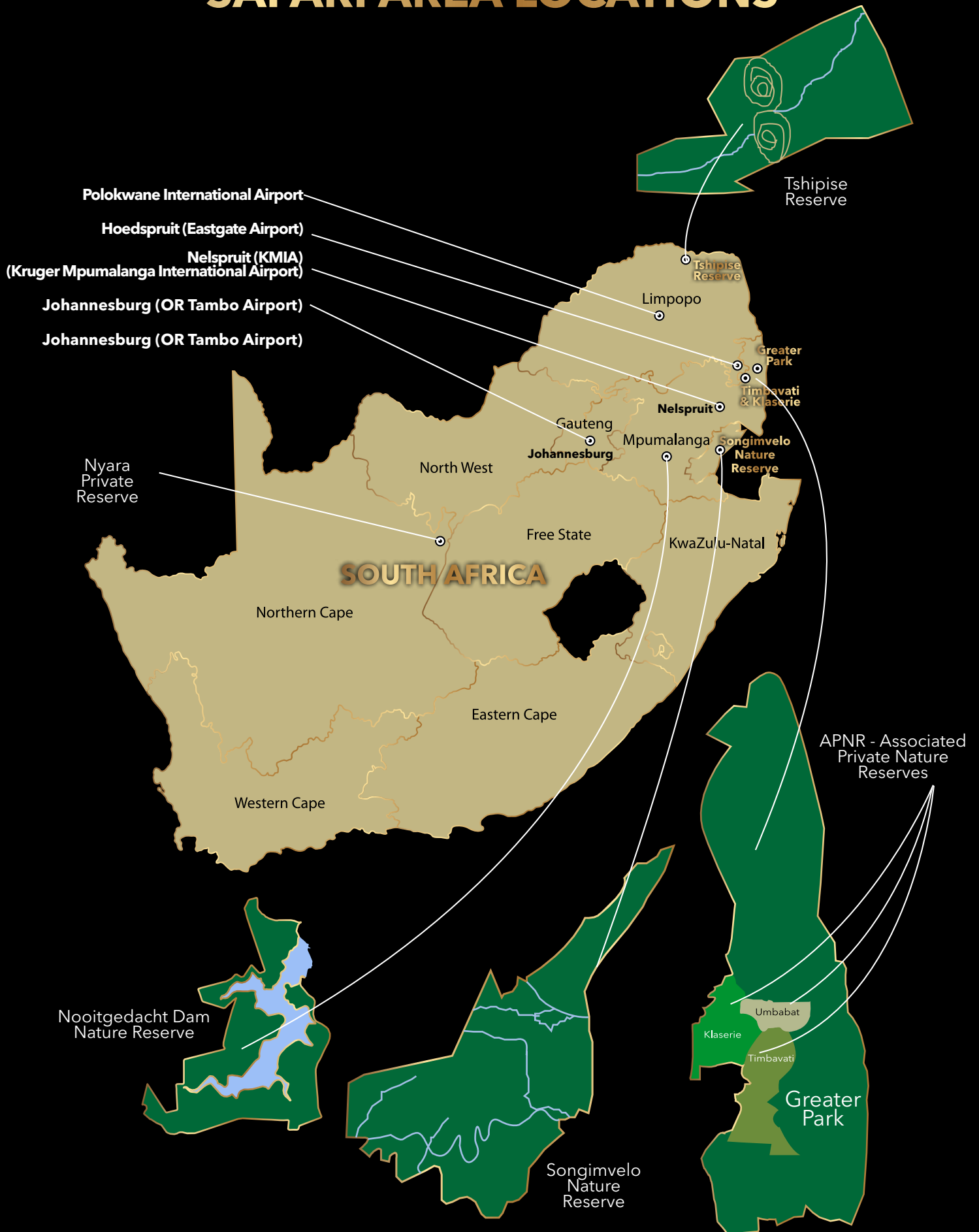

HUNTING & SAFARI CONDITIONS

Trophy hunting is available year round in South Africa, although our summer months (November through February) tend to be very hot, these months offer very good hunting, but one must keep in mind this is also our rainy season.

We usually start hunting in April and things tend to slow down towards the end of October. (June/July is our two coldest winter months). It is hard to say when the best time is to come over on Safari, species and the area where the hunt will take place has the most impact as to when to conduct the Safari. Please contact me personally and we can discuss this very important aspect of your Safari. Due to the vastness of all our areas, the locating of game is done by travelling in a Land Cruiser Safari vehicle from where all hunting is done on foot.

All our Safari camps offer accommodation of the highest standard, whether in our traditional tented or thatched Safari camps. These camps are comfortable and safe, and we will cater to each guest's individual needs. All rooms are private and have en-suite bathrooms, with hot and cold running water and flush toilets.

Camp staff will ensure that bathrooms are cleaned, rooms are tidy, and laundry is done daily. Graham Sales Safaris caters for specific dietary and beverage preferences. (Please complete our "Dietary requirements" document and email to our offices at least 60 days prior to commencement of your Safari). At GSS we will make sure each and every guest's specific needs are taken into account and are well taken care of.

- **Hunting on a free-range area as well as a Nature Reserve (Songimvelo Nature Reserve, Nooitgedacht Dam Nature Reserve and Timbavati/Klaserie Private Nature Reserves)**

Our offices need to buy a free-range hunting permit from our local authorities several weeks before the commencement of each Safari. This hunting permit will be issued in the specific hunter's name and the specific species the hunter would like to hunt, will be specified on the permit. No hunting can be done without a permit in the specific hunter's name that stipulates the species the hunter is interested in hunting.

- Our offices will need a clear (scanned) copy of your (Hunter's) passport for us to be able to apply for the permit mentioned above.
- According to our regulations, we will need a signed copy of our "Release of liability and assumption of risk" document emailed to our offices prior to the commencement of your Safari. (available on our website)

General information - Coutada de Marangira - Mozambique



Province: Niassa Province.

Location: We hunt 988,000 acres of pristine wilderness in the Niassa province - North-western Mozambique. The area is situated north of the small town called Marrupa located south of Block C - Niassa Reserve. The concession is flanked on the left by the Ruambeze and on the west by Lureco rivers. The main habitat is Miombo woodland with open Savannah areas, seasonal wetlands and riverine forests along the many water courses, rivers and streams. The landscape is scattered with spectacular rock formations and mountains, many of them have thickets of montane forest growing in the narrow gullies that extend up the smooth - sided rock faces. The magnificent scenery combined with the vastness of the area, abundance of game and pristine nature makes this without a doubt one of Africa's last great wilderness areas.

Area size: 988,000 acres.

Rainy Season: Generally our rains are from November/December through to March.

Climate: 40°F (4°C) is the coldest it will get at night or early morning. (June / July) 110°F (43°C) is the warmest it will get if it is sunny and dry from October onwards. Typically, around 85°F (30°C).

Logistics:

On the international flight; one will arrive in Johannesburg (OR Tambo International Airport) from where one has two options to get to Safari camp:

1. Take a connecting flight from Johannesburg to Pemba where one can spend the night in a beautiful sea front guest house, have a good rest and take a charter flight to camp the next morning or charter to camp immediately after one has cleared customs upon arrival in Pemba. Our airstrip is about a 15-minute drive from camp. (preferred option)

2. One can take a connecting flight from Johannesburg to Maputo from where another connecting flight to Lichinga is needed. From Lichinga it is a 7-hour drive to Safari camp.

- We do have two local representatives at Pemba Airport to assist our guests with customs formalities. (Alex & Izaki).



Visa & Passports: A Visa for Mozambique is required by all foreign citizens. All visitors arriving in Mozambique must have a passport which is valid for at least a further 6 months after the date of arrival in Mozambique. The Visa cost is roughly US\$100.00. (At this stage foreign citizens can obtain a tourist Visa at Pemba Airport)

Hunting season: The hunting season starts 1 April and ends on 30 November – personally we prefer the months towards the end of the season (August / September / October / November) for the following reasons; most of the tall grass has been burnt and new fresh grass is coming out which, not only attracts game but one's visibility is much better; the area does have a lot of water but some temporary watering holes and fountains have dried up by then so game is certainly more concentrated.



Searching for Buffalo and Leopard tracks

Typical hunting day:

Wake-up call is early each morning, one will have a preferred breakfast and we will leave camp before sunrise. (A packed breakfast can also be taken along as some guests do not prefer to eat that early). If Leopard is the priority specie, I strongly believe that one should focus on Leopard first. One will shoot bait animals while looking for new bait locations while checking existing baits. Once one is successful on the Leopard one can start to focus on Buffalo and all other desired species. (I'm not saying we will not take a desired trophy animal if the opportunity presents itself but one must focus on Leopard before one goes looking for some other species and the Leopard hunt does not get the necessary attention that it requires). If Leopard is not the preferred or priority specie one will look for fresh Buffalo or Eland tracks to follow, most other plains game species are being spot from the back of the hunting vehicle from where a stalk is planned or one will walk into these big open grasslands where we usually find animals as a more opportunistic approach. (One might spend a few nights in one of our fly camps all depending on the desired specie/s)

- Typical shot distances on plains game can vary from 50 - 220 yards.
 - On Buffalo the average is probably between 40 - 80 yards.
 - On Leopard the typical shot distance will be between 50 - 120 yards. (120 yards does sound far but the location of the blind in relation to the bait is crucial for success).
- We will have a packed lunch with us each day and will take some time during mid - day to have a meal and relax down in a riverbed or somewhere in the shade. (Our vehicles are equipped with electric fridges that will be stocked daily with bottled water and soft drinks). After lunch we will continue hunting and slowly work our way back towards camp. Due to the vastness of the area, we usually get back to camp after sunset. Back in camp one will take a hot shower, change into comfortable clothes and relax around the campfire, before having a warm dinner and a good night's rest.

Taxidermist: Life Form Taxidermy.

Hunting license: Hunters need a license to hunt any game in Mozambique. We buy the license for dangerous game species well in advance of the commencement of the specific Safari. On plains game we can buy the license after the specific species has been hunted. This being said, we need to know or have a very good idea of which plains game species each hunter is interested in hunting prior to the Safari.

Species available for hunting: Our Marangira area is home to prolific wildlife to say the least, including Elephant, Cheetah, the critically endangered African Wild dog, and a very healthy Lion, population, with an abundance of Buffalo, Bushpig, Bushbuck (Chobe), Reedbuck (Common - Northern), Zebra (Crawshay's), Duiker (Niassa), Eland (Livingstone's), Leopard, Hartebeest (Lichtenstein's), Wildebeest (Niassa), Sable (Roosevelt), Hyena (Spotted), Waterbuck (Niassa), and with Warthog in high numbers. **We are proud to say this is one of the few blocks where one can hunt several of East Africa's endemic species namely:** Crawshay's Zebra, Niassa Wildebeest, Roosevelt Sable, Johnston's Impala, Lichtenstein's Hartebeest and Chobe Bushbuck. "Personally, I find it hard to believe that an area with a higher population of Leopard, Cape Buffalo, Roosevelt Sable, and Livingstone's Eland exists in Southern Africa than this specific block". In general, exceptional trophy quality goes hand in hand with high populations of game.



We have two 'fly' camps in our area, both locations are strategical and on major river systems. We usually spend a few nights of a Safari in either one of our 'fly' camps. The reason for this is to be in or very close to an area where we want to hunt the next few days. Due to the vastness of the area, it is essential to have strategically located "fly" camps on the Concession.

- Logistics:** Maun International Airport in Botswana will be the arrival and departure point for your Safari. Road transfer to the camp is between 2 ½ - 3 hours.
- Concession:** Our Concession lies in the North central part of Botswana, just east of the Okavango Delta. This block is known as NG41 and belongs to the Mababe community who lives in this area.
- Camp:** Our East African style camp is located in the heart of the concession and comprises of all the basic luxuries you would expect in a premium hunting camp. The camp is tented and all tents are en-suite with a shower, flushing toilet and hot water.
- Electricity:** Our camp runs on solar power with a generator as a backup system. Devices can be charged in camp or in our vehicles during the day.
- Wi-Fi:** Available in camp.

Typical hunting day: Wake up will be about an hour to half an hour before sunrise (month dependent). We usually have a warm breakfast of choice and will head out immediately thereafter. In general, due to the vastness of the area we take a packed lunch with us and enjoy the lunch break either in a dry riverbed or in the shade of a big "Nyala berry" tree (on occasion we will return to camp for lunch). After lunch we will continue with the afternoon hunt. We will head back to camp at around, or just after sunset. Once in camp a hot shower is usually in the order of the day after which we will meet around the campfire for a cocktail after which we will have warm hearty dinner.

Hunting in Botswana: From the dry Kalahari dunes, to flowing rivers of the Okavango Delta. Botswana is a low populated country with a dense wildlife population. A Southern African country bordering South Africa to the south, Zimbabwe to the east, Namibia to the west and the mighty Zambezi / Chobe Zambia rivers to the north. The Okavango Delta was originally inaccessible until hunters ventured into these wild areas and created access into what is known today as one of the premier photographic areas in Africa. Our hunting concession is one of the few hunting concessions left in these northern parts of Botswana where we mostly hunt Elephant, Buffalo, Leopard and various plains game species.

Taxidermist: Mochaba Trophy Dealers.

Botswana NG41 (Mababe)



This beautiful concession is partially located in the well-known Mababe Depression, an area that was hunted by early explorer and adventurer William Cornwallis Harris during the late 1830's. It is located to the south of the Chobe National Park and to the east of the Moremi Game Reserve with the Khwai River flowing through the western part of the area. This concession is known for its beautiful Mopane woodland dotted with large rain filled depressions or pans. It is home to a diversity of both migratory and resident dangerous and plains game species. Elephants migrate on a seasonal basis through the area between the adjacent Okavango Delta and Chobe zone.

N#AJAQNA Conservancy: The conservancy is inhabited by only 3,700 nomadic San (Bushman) tribe and are more than 3,522 square miles or 2,254,080 acres of Kalahari sand. The landscape is very flat and intertwined with beautiful Acacia woodland.

Species on quota: Trophy Elephant, Leopard, Eland, Gemsbuck, Kudu, Steenbuck, Warthog and Duiker.

ONDJOU Conservancy: Ondjou Conservancy is also known as Hereroland (named after the approximately 2,000 Herero people in the area). Consists of 3,370 square miles or 2,156,800 acres. The vegetation is Kalahari sand, grasslands and a series of pans that provides much needed water for lephant and various other species.

Species on quota: Elephant (Trophy & Management), Leopard, Kudu, Gemsbuck, Black-backed Jackal, Ostrich, and Warthog.



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
