Msaize Concession (Savé Valley Conservancy)



Remote, wild, unfenced offering true fair chase hunting

The area falls within the Savé Valley Conservancy (SVC) that is situated in the South Eastern part of Zimbabwe, the SVC is world famous as a top safari destination. The Savé Valley Conservancy is located in South Eastern Zimbabwe and is home to Africa's Big Seven (Cape Buffalo, Crocodile, Elephant, Hippo, White Rhino, Leopard and Lion).

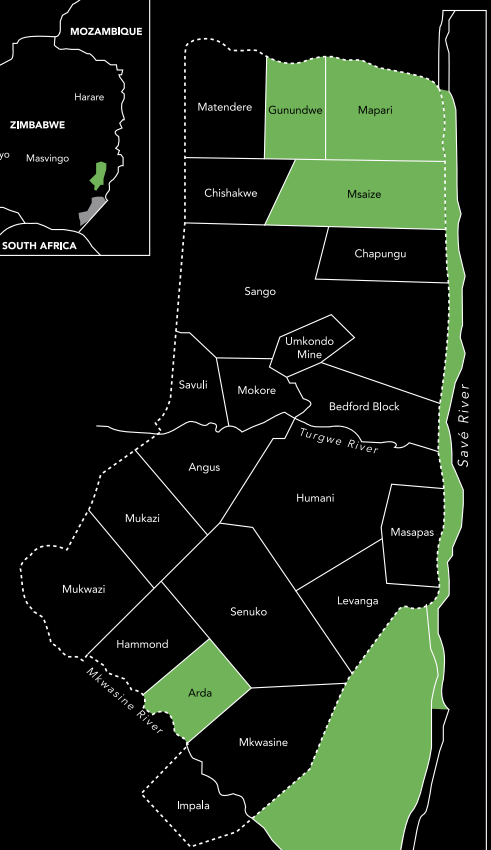
The Conservancy was established in 1991, it is comprised of 21 adjacent properties with no internal fencing, totaling 900 000 acres which makes the Savé Valley Conservancy, Africa's largest privately owned Conservancy.

Graham Sales Safaris hunts 220 000 acres within the Conservancy (as indicated on the map) and our area has a very healthy and diverse range of Big Game and Plains Game species due to the fact that we have the Save river running for 68 miles through and along our concession which makes for excellent Buffalo, Elephant, Leopard, Lion and hunting not to mention Crocodile and enormous Hippo. Plains game trophies include: Duiker, Baboon, Blue Wildebeest, Bushbuck, Bushpig, Eland, Giraffe, Impala, Klipspringer Kudu, Nyala, Sable, Waterbuck, Warthog and Zebra, as well as some nocturnal species like, Civet Cat, African Wildcat, Porcupine, Large and Small spotted Genet.

Our camp offers four thatched Safari tents with en-suite bathrooms. The camp is run on 220v power supply, on a generator system. Daily laundry service is provided, so no need to bring an extensive supply of clothing. An experienced caterer and host with a full complement of camp staff will see to your every need.

Access to our concession is by light aircraft or road transfer from Harare International Airport. We are 255 miles by road or a 1hr flight.

While we are open year-round, our suggested hunting months are April through early November.
