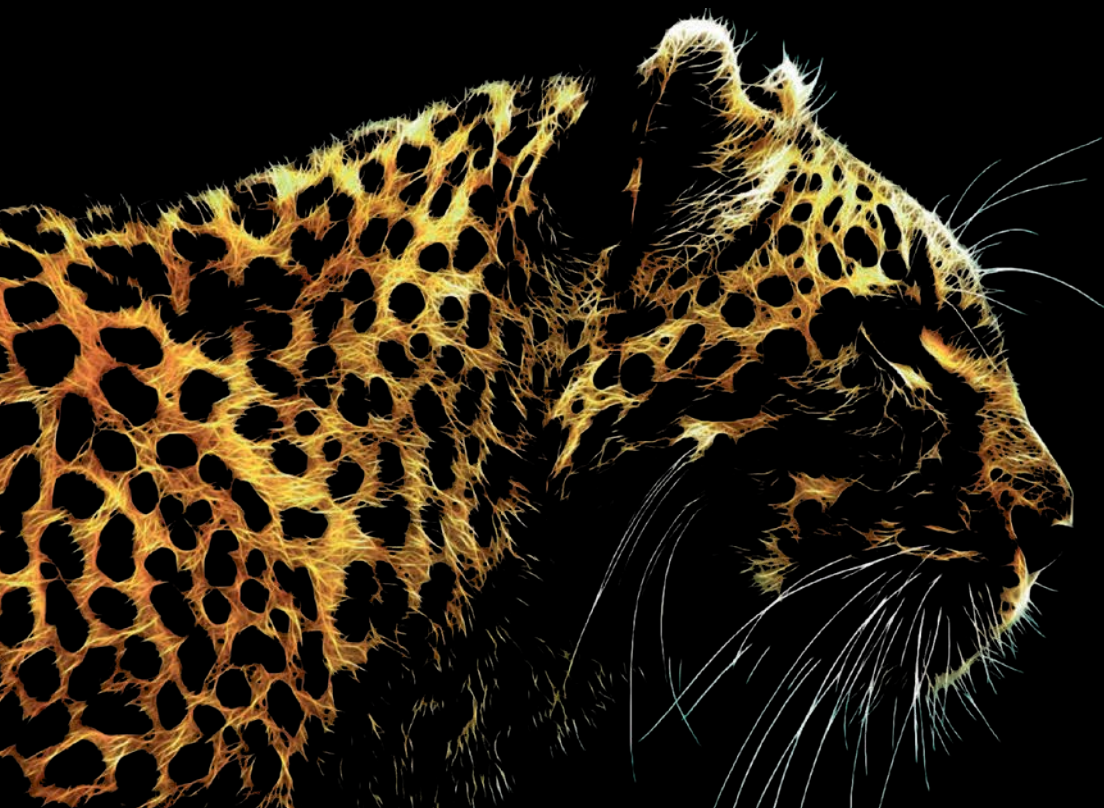

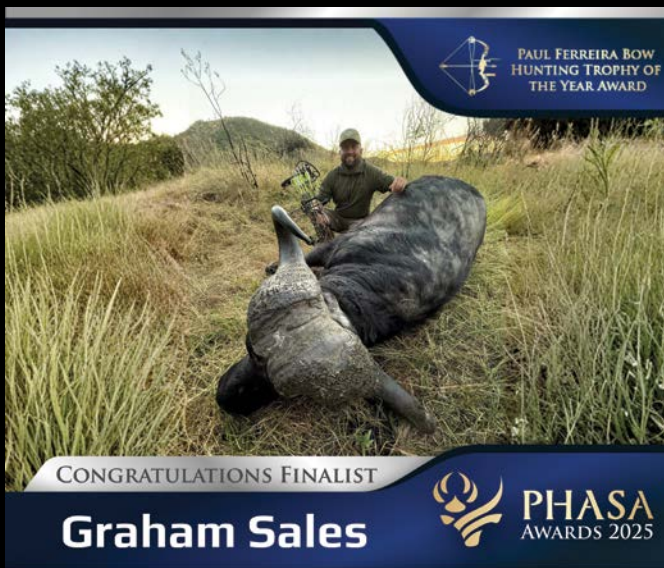

Species on quota: Blesbuck, Blue Wildebeest, Bushbuck (Cape), Bushpig, Cape Buffalo, Eland, Giraffe, Impala, Kudu (Southern Greater), Mountain Reedbuck, Red Hartebeest, Waterbuck, Zebra (Burchell's). (Brown Hyena, Bushpig, Common Duiker, Crocodile, Elephant, Hippo, Leopard, Springbuck and Warthog are also on the Reserve).

Nooitgedacht Dam Nature Reserve

Species on quota: Black-backed Jackal, Black Wildebeest, Blesbuck, Common Reedbuck, Red Hartebeest, Springbuck. (Cape Buffalo, Oribi and Zebra (Burchell's) are also on the Reserve)

Timbavati & Klaserie Private Nature Reserves

Species on quota: Blue Wildebeest, Cape Buffalo (Bull & cow), Elephant, Giraffe, Hippo, Impala, Kudu (Southern Greater), Spotted Hyena, Warthog, Waterbuck, Zebra (Burchell's)
(African Wild Dog, Black Rhino, Cheetah, Crocodile, Leopard, Lion, White Rhino and various plains game species are also on the Reserve)

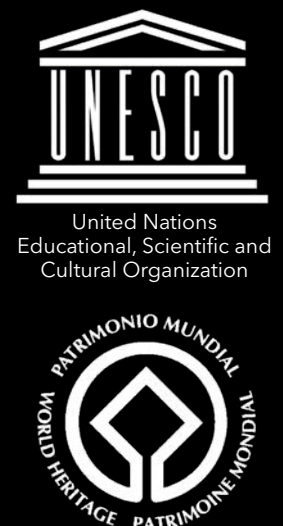

Barberton Makhonjwa Mountains WORLD HERITAGE SITE



Barberton Makhonjwa Mountains World Heritage Site received inscription in July 2018 at the 42nd Session of the UNESCO World Heritage Committee held in the Kingdom of Bahrain in Manama. An area of about 115 137 ha was inscribed with land ownership including State; private/corporate; Communal Trusts and CPA's (Communal Property Association) Outstanding Universal Value (OUV) which the site portrays:

- The rocks that are found at this site demonstrates an Archaean stage of Earth's history, including the earliest record of life forms as well as the earliest and most significant geomorphic and physiographic features being the result of processes in the development of the planet's ocean, atmosphere, and landforms.
- The site provides a 340 million year old window into the early Earth, right at the time life began. Physical evidence of first life forms has been found in these rocks with some of it so clear it can be seen with the naked eye.
- Current geological sites included on the World Heritage List are not comparable to any other in the World. Granite greenstone belts are significant features that are not represented among any properties currently inscribed on the World Heritage List under criterion (viii).
- Criterion include outstanding examples representing major stages of earth's history including the record of life, significant on-going geological processes in the development of landforms, or significant geomorphic or physiographic features.



Songimvelo Nature Reserve

South Africa's largest provincial Nature Reserve



Transfrontier Park with World Heritage status

Songimvelo Nature Reserve is South Africa's largest Provincial Nature Reserve and forms part of the Songimvelo-Malotja Transfrontier Conservation area, a peace park located south of Barberton, in the south-eastern part of the Mpumalanga Province on the South African - Swaziland border.

The incredible beauty of its range of mountains, which forms one of the oldest regions on earth, with incredible volcanic and sedimentary rocks, examples of which are exceeded only by those found in Greenland. Rolling hills, hidden valleys, wide open plains and forest ravines support an incredible diversity of wildlife, plants and habitats. Along the valley floor winds the Komati River, after which it flows into Swaziland and to the Indian Ocean.

The grassy plains of Songimvelo Nature Reserve are home to herds of Buffalo, Blesbuck, Blue Wildebeest, Bushpig, Eland, Impala, Red Hartebeest and Zebra whilst within the wooded and hillside areas one will find Bushbuck, Giraffe, Kudu, Mountain Reedbuck and Elephant.

Concession: Graham Sales / Graham Sales Safaris Pty. Ltd is the concession holder and has the exclusive rights to conduct Safaris on Songimvelo Nature Reserve and Nooitgedacht Dam Nature Reserve.

Logistics: Upon your arrival day, as specified in your Safari contract, you will need to fly to the city of Mbombela, landing at Kruger Mpumalanga International Airport (KMIA). Upon completion of your Safari, you will return to Johannesburg from KMIA on your day of departure. Please note that, on occasion, the Safari itinerary may change, resulting in the Safari ending in a different location than initially planned. If there is a possibility that your Safari may conclude in an alternative area, it is important to confirm with Graham regarding the alternative airport for your departure flight back to Johannesburg.

Camp: Luxury Safari style lodge. Each room has an ensuite bathroom (bath and shower) complete with a cozy fireplace for the colder months like June and July. Please see our website for pictures of the accommodation.

Electricity: Our camp runs on local 220V power. (Two and three point plugs available in each room) Most modern-day chargers accept 110 – 220 Volts. Please check that yours does comply or else you will need to bring a converter from 220 Volts to 110 Volts. Please bring a multi plug adaptor along to avoid disappointment.

Wi-Fi: Available in our dining / lodge area but not in the rooms.

Hunting season: 1 April to 31 October.

Hunting method: Rifle (MTPA – Mpumalanga Tourism and Parks Agency does not allow bow, handgun and muzzleloader hunting on any of the Nature Reserves.

Hunting permit: We will apply for the necessary hunting permit in your (the hunter's name). Each hunter needs a hunting permit (our office needs to be informed well in advance as to which species and number of each species every hunter is interested in hunting). One cannot hunt any species that does not occur on the hunter's hunting permit.

Species available for hunting: Blesbuck, Blue Wildebeest, Bushbuck, Bushpig, Cape Buffalo, Giraffe, Impala, Kudu (Southern Greater), Mountain Reedbuck, Red Hartebeest, Waterbuck, Warthog and Zebra (Burchell's).

Typical hunting day: The day begins approximately half an hour before sunrise, providing an early start to maximise our time in the field. Upon waking, guests will enjoy a light breakfast, choosing from coffee, toast, cereal, or their preferred option. Immediately after breakfast, we will set out to commence the day's activities without delay. A packed lunch will be provided, allowing us to take a relaxing break during the day. Lunch will be enjoyed in a tranquil setting, either along the banks of the Komati River or shaded beneath a large Paperbark tree, offering an opportunity to rest and appreciate the natural surroundings. Following lunch, the afternoon will be dedicated to continuing the hunt, with activities lasting until around sunset. At the end of the day, we will return to camp to unwind. Upon arrival at camp, a hot shower will be available, providing comfort after a long day outdoors. The evening will conclude with a gathering for cocktails, followed by a warm and hearty dinner, ensuring a relaxing and enjoyable end to the day.

Taxidermist: Life Form Taxidermy will collect all trophies at the conclusion of every two-month period. The timing of these collections may vary depending on the total number of trophies ready for transport. Once your trophies have been received and checked in at the Life Form Taxidermy facilities, a representative will contact you to confirm their arrival and provide any necessary updates regarding the next steps in processing. Life Form Taxidermy is in White River, which is approximately a two-and-a-half-hour drive north of Songimvelo Nature Reserve.

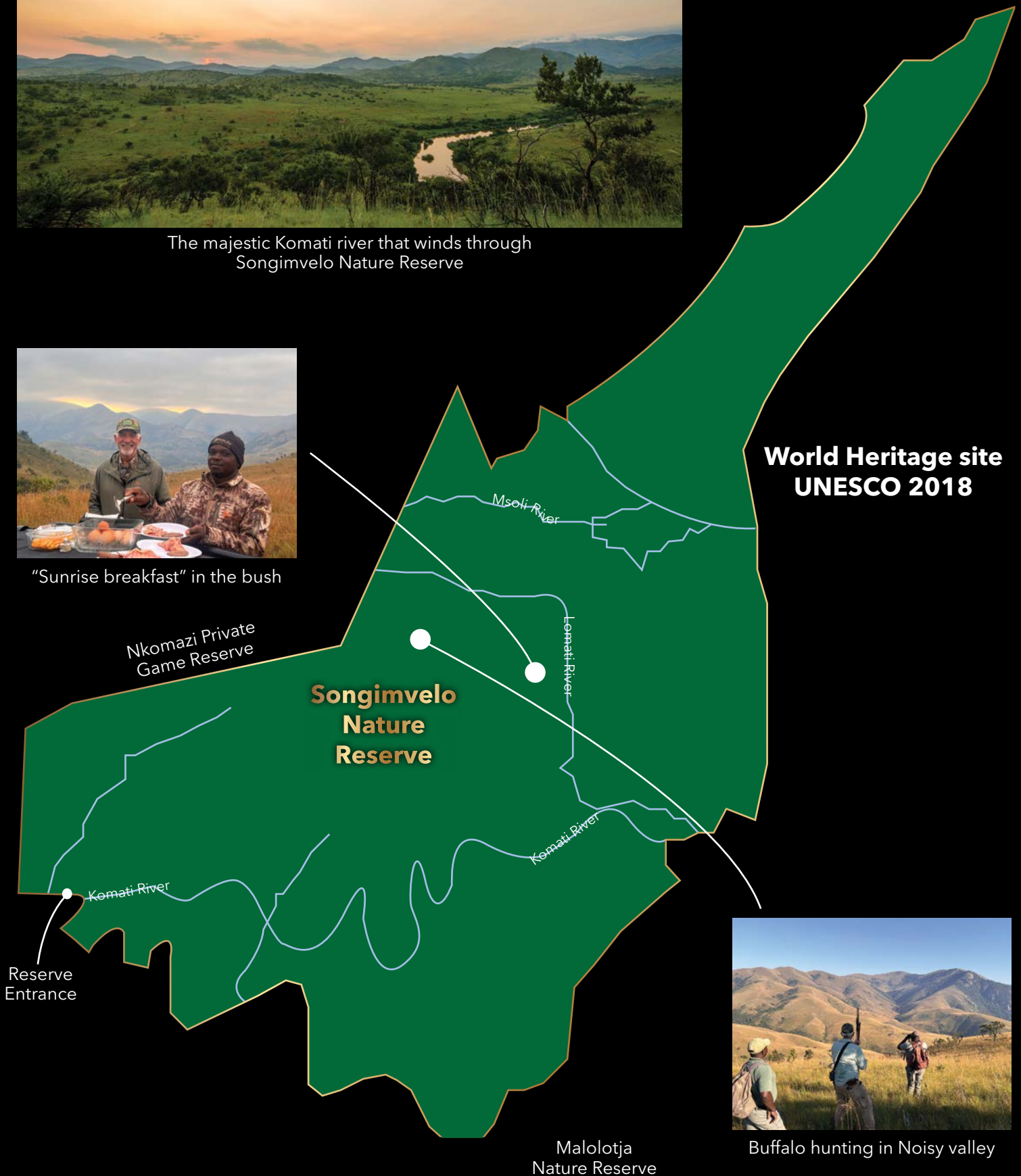

NOOITGEDACHT DAM NATURE RESERVE

This part of Mpumalanga is renowned for its grasslands and wetlands, forming a distinctive natural region.

Nooitgedacht dam is just a single example among the many water spots, lakes, and streams that contribute to the region's natural beauty and plentiful water resources.

It is no surprise that an extensive wetland complex is situated within the Nooitgedacht Dam Nature Reserve. This reserve is home to numerous important ecosystems and supports a variety of wildlife, all of which are protected within its boundaries.

Nooitgedacht Dam Nature Reserve is located directly east of Songimvelo Nature Reserve, further highlighting its significance within the region.

The Nooitgedacht Dam Nature Reserve is also one of MTPA's (Mpumalanga Tourism and Parks Agency) Nature Reserves. The Reserve which surrounds the Nooitgedacht dam is in the Highveld of the Mpumalanga Province and approximately 10 miles northwest of the small town of Carolina. The Reserve is a quick drive in a south-westerly direction from Songimvelo Nature Reserve.

Numerous game species are to be found in the Reserve, Black-backed Jackal, Black Wildebeest, Blesbuck, Cape Buffalo, Common Reedbuck, Oribi, Red Hartebeest, Springbuck and Zebra. The Reserve surrounds the Nooitgedacht dam where the Komati River originates, which from there flows down to Songimvelo Nature Reserve. Other important tributaries are the Boesmanspruit, Witkloofspruit and the Vaalwaterspruit.

Logistics:

Nooitgedacht Dam Nature Reserve is located about 1½ hour drive southwest from Songimvelo Nature Reserve. If our clients are interested in any of the species on Nooitgedacht Dam Nature Reserve we do a "day trip" to the Reserve.

Timbavati Private Nature Reserve

True Africa where Africa's "dangerous 7" roams free

The Timbavati Private Nature Reserve forms part of the "Greater Park" area, which allows free movement of game across 432 000 acres of land. The area is made up of Mopani bushveld, Acacia shrub, watering holes and riverbeds that attract a huge variety of game including Buffalo, Black Rhino, Blue Wildebeest, Elephant, Giraffe, Hippo, Impala, Kudu, White Rhino, Waterbuck, Zebra and several other antelope species. These in turn attract a number of predators, such as Lion, Leopard, Cheetah and Hyena, which makes this a popular choice for a traditional African Safari.

Our clients will experience a free range Safari. Our tented Safari camp is located on the banks of the Nhlalalumi river which adds to the true African Safari experience that we offer.

- Area size:** 130,965 acres.
- Logistics:** A connecting flight from Johannesburg (OR Tambo International Airport) to Hoedspruit (Eastgate Airport) is required. Please discuss the return flight options with our offices as one might change to a different area after being successful in the Timbavati.
- Camp:** Our traditional tented Safari camp (4 tents) is located on the banks of the Nhlalalumi river. Each tent has an en-suite bathroom with hot and cold running water. Our "dining area" is around the campfire.
- Electricity:** Our camp runs on solar power. Devices can either be charged in camp or in our vehicles during the day. 220 V electricity available at our headquarters which is a 40-minute drive from Safari camp.
Please bring a multi plug adaptor along to avoid inconvenience.
- Wi-Fi:** Only at our headquarters during the day. (45-minutes' drive from camp)
Satellite wi-fi available in camp at \$20 per day.

- Hunting season:** 1 April of the current year through end of March the following year.
- Hunting permit:** We will apply for the necessary hunting permit in your name. Each hunter needs a hunting permit (our offices need to know exactly what species each hunter is interested in hunting for us to be able to apply for each individual specie in the hunter's name).
- Species available for hunting:** Cape Buffalo bulls, Cape Buffalo cows, Elephant, Hippo, Hyena and a Plains Game package (1 x Blue Wildebeest, 1 x Giraffe, 1 x Impala, 1 x Kudu, 1 x Warthog, 1 x Waterbuck and 1 x Zebra).
- Typical hunting day:** Wake-up time is scheduled approximately one hour to thirty minutes before sunrise, depending on the month. A warm breakfast of choice is served, followed by prompt departure for the day's activities. Given the expansive nature of the terrain, a packed lunch is typically provided and enjoyed either at a dry riverbed or under the shade of a large Nyala berry tree; occasionally, we may return to camp for lunch. After the lunch break, the afternoon hunt commences. We return to camp around or shortly after sunset, where a hot shower is customarily available at the conclusion of the day.
- Taxidermist:** Life Form Taxidermy will collect all trophies at the conclusion of every two-month period. The timing of these collections may vary depending on the total number of trophies ready for transport.
Once your trophies have been received and checked in at the Life Form Taxidermy facilities, a representative will contact you to confirm their arrival and provide any necessary updates regarding the next steps in processing.
Life Form Taxidermy is in White River, which is approximately a two-hour drive south of the Timbavati Private Nature Reserve.

Timbavati / Klaserie / Umbabat Private Nature Reserves APNR (Associated Private Nature Reserves)



As illustrated on the map, Timbavati Private Nature Reserve is part of the "Greater Park" (green area). There are no fences separating these reserves (Klaserie, Timbavati, Umbabat), allowing wildlife to move freely among all four areas. This region is considered one of South Africa's most unspoiled wildlife habitats, where it is possible to observe between 1,000 and 2,000 Buffalo during a seven-day Safari.



Tshipise Reserve

.....home of four of Africa's Big Five.....



Since 1974, Tshipise Reserve has been privately owned and managed by a family deeply committed to Africa and its wildlife, as well as leaders in South African conservation. Covering over 55,000 acres of unbroken wilderness, the reserve is home to four of Africa's Big Five—Buffalo, Elephant, Leopard, and both White and Black Rhino. The area is carefully overseen to preserve its natural ecological balance. Featuring Mopane and Acacia shrubs, towering mountains, massive Baobab trees, dry riverbeds, and vast open plains, the reserve supports more than 8,000 game animals. Without question, Tshipise Reserve stands out as one of Southern Africa's premier conservation areas.

General information - Tshipise Reserve

Country: South Africa.

Location: Limpopo province (Northeast).

Elevation: 1,800 feet above sea level.

Area size: 55,000 acres.

Logistics: A connecting flight from Johannesburg (OR Tambo International Airport) is required on your designated "arrival day" (as specified in your Safari contract) to either Hoedspruit (Eastgate Airport) or Polokwane International Airport. Your return flight to Johannesburg will depart from Hoedspruit or Polokwane International Airport on your departure day. Please note that, on occasion, the itinerary may change during the Safari, which could result in the Safari concluding at a different location than initially planned. If there is a possibility that your Safari itinerary may end in an alternative location, kindly confirm with Graham regarding the appropriate airport for your departure flight to Johannesburg.

Camp: Our safari camp is designed to ensure privacy, offering five double rooms, each with en-suite bathrooms, electricity, and a full range of essential amenities. Guests are invited to experience exceptional cuisine, served either in the thatched dining area or by the campfire in the evening. The camp also features an elegantly furnished open lounge area, providing a comfortable space for relaxation.

Electricity: Our camp uses a local 220 V power supply, and each room or tent has both two- and three-point plugs. Most modern chargers support 110-220 Volts, but please check yours to be sure; if not, bring a converter from 220 Volts to 110 Volts. To prevent any inconvenience, remember to pack a multi-plug adaptor. You can charge your devices either at the camp or in our vehicles during the day.

Hunting season: At Tshipise Reserve, hunting is permitted throughout the year; however, the typical hunting season generally extends from 1 April to 31 October.

Hunting method: Rifle, Bow and Handgun.

Species available for hunting: Baboon, Black-backed Jackal, Blue Wildebeest, Cape Buffalo, Common Duiker, Eland, Gemsbok, Giraffe, Kudu (Southern Greater), Impala, Klipspringer, Nyala, Red Hartebeest, Roan Antelope, Sable Antelope, Steenbuck, Tsessebe, Warthog, Waterbuck and Zebra (Burchell's and Hartmann's).

Typical hunting day: The day usually begins about half an hour before sunrise. We have a hot breakfast of your choice, then head out right after. Around midday, we return to camp for lunch and take a short break before leaving again for the afternoon hunt. We get back to camp at or just after sunset. Once there, a hot shower is generally welcome, followed by gathering around the campfire for a warm, hearty dinner.

Taxidermist: Life Form Taxidermy will collect all trophies at the conclusion of each two-month period, based on the volume of trophies. Upon receipt and inspection of your trophies at their facility, Life Form Taxidermy will reach out to you for further communication. The company is located in White River, which is approximately a 30-minute drive north from our offices in Nelspruit.

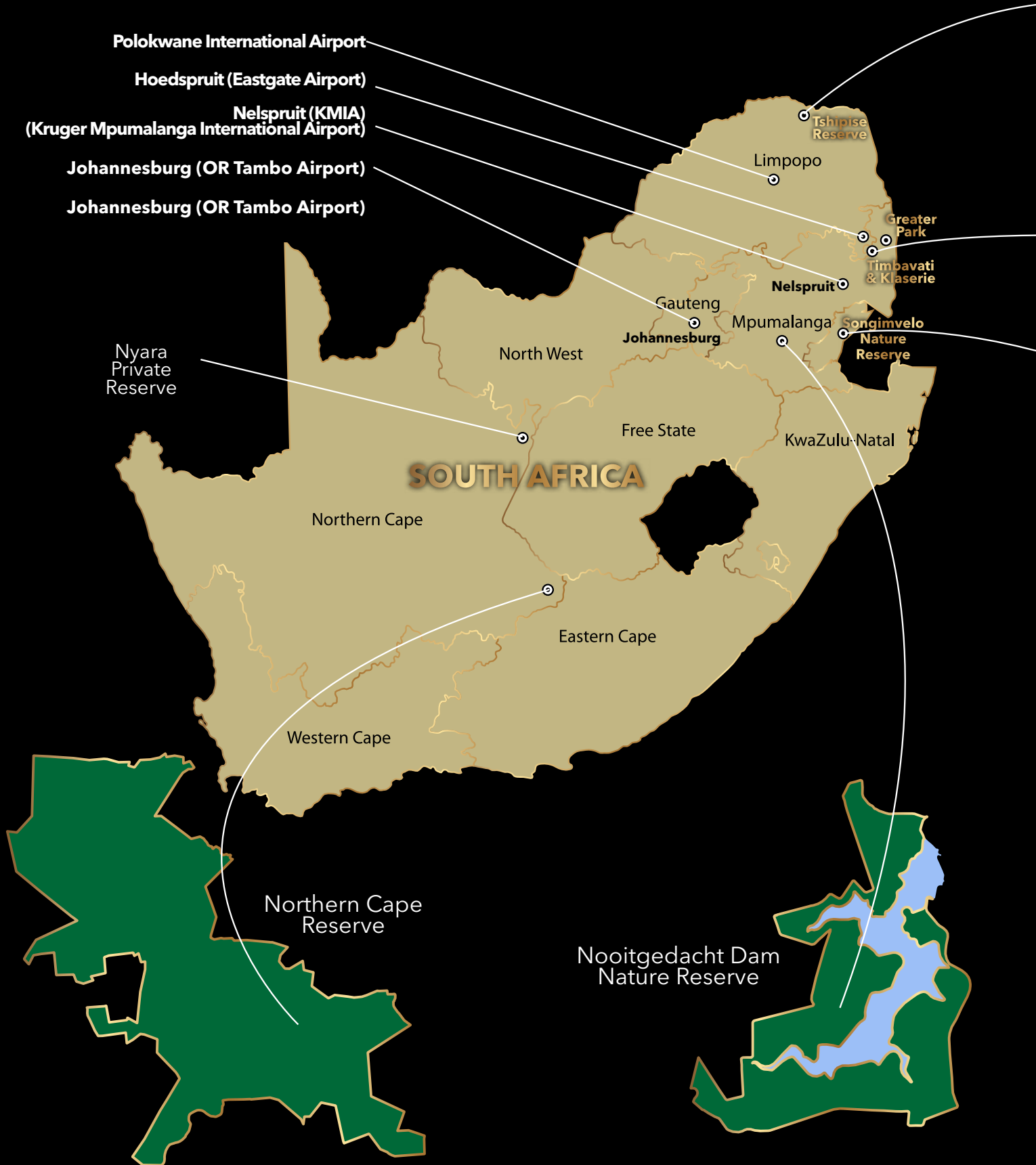

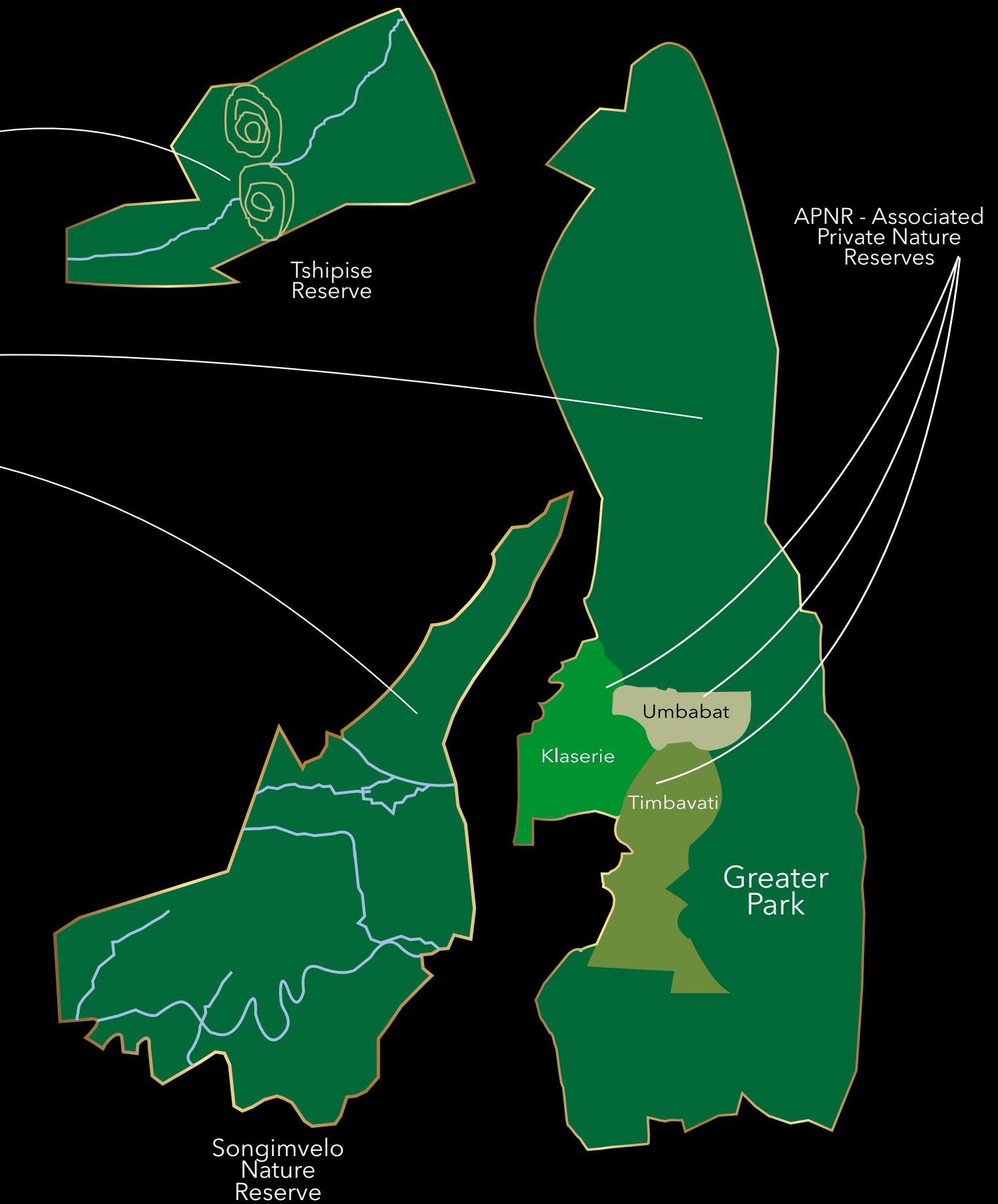

"The Reserve" is home to over 12,000 head of game including:

17 species of antelope, 900 + Buffalo, 1,000+ Eland, 4,000+ Springbuck, 1,000+ Gemsbok, 350+ Roan Antelope, 300+ Sable Antelope, 4 different colour variants of Springbok.

We are committed to fair chase hunting. Pursue world class trophy game on 255 square miles of land. Stalking is done on foot where you are accompanied by an experienced GSS Professional Hunter and field staff who will point out mature trophy quality game and share their knowledge of the land and animals along the way. Today "The Reserve" is one of the largest privately owned single unit properties in South Africa.

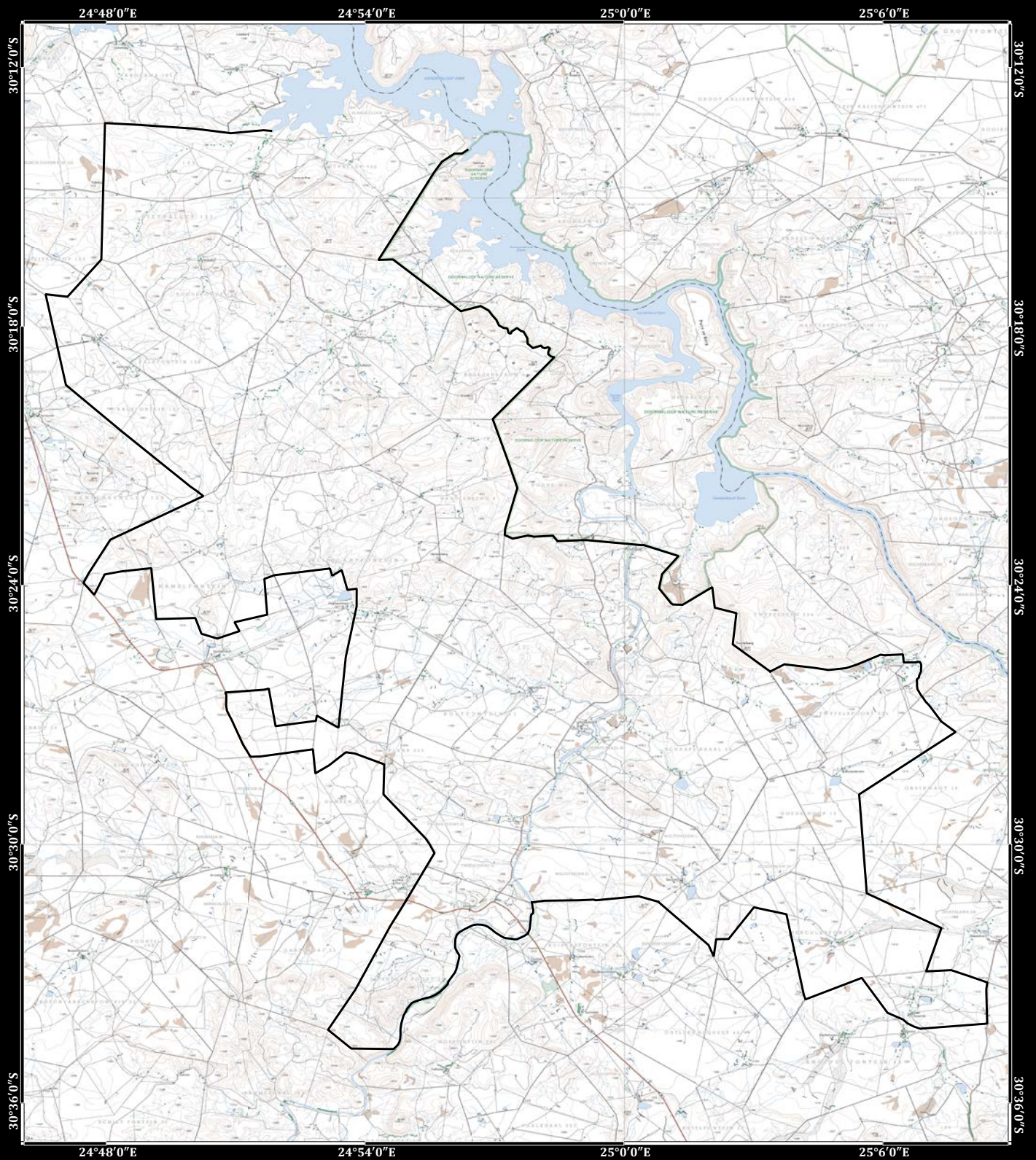

Hunting & Safari conditions

Trophy hunting is available throughout the year in South Africa. While the summer months (November through February) can be very hot—and coincide with the rainy season—they still provide quality hunting opportunities. Our hunting activities typically commence in April and taper off towards the end of October, with June and July representing our coldest winter months. Determining the optimal time for a Safari depends largely on the species sought and the location of the hunt. For tailored advice regarding your Safari, please contact me directly so we can discuss this important consideration.

Game is located by traversing our expansive areas in a Land Cruiser Safari vehicle, after which all hunting is conducted on foot. Our Safari camps offer accommodations of the highest standard, whether in our traditional tented or thatched lodgings. These camps are designed to provide comfort and safety, with every effort made to meet each guest's individual requirements. All rooms are private and equipped with en-suite bathrooms featuring hot and cold running water as well as flush toilets.

Dedicated camp staff ensure daily maintenance, including cleaning of bathrooms, tidying of rooms, and laundry services. Graham Sales Safaris accommodates specific dietary and beverage preferences. Kindly complete our "Dietary Requirements" document and submit it to our office at least 60 days prior to the start of your Safari.

Notes:

Hunting within Free-Range areas and Nature Reserves

(Songimvelo Nature Reserve, Nooitgedacht Dam Nature Reserve, and Timbavati/Klaserie Private Nature Reserves):

1. Our offices are required to obtain a free-range hunting permit from local authorities several weeks prior to the start of each Safari. This permit will be issued in the specific hunter's name and will indicate the species approved for hunting. Hunting is strictly prohibited without the appropriate permit that clearly states both the hunter's identity and the designated species.

2. A clear, scanned copy of the hunter's passport must be provided to our offices to facilitate the permit application process.

3. In accordance with relevant regulations, a signed copy of our "Release of liability and assumption of risk" document must be completed, signed and emailed to our offices before your Safari begins. This document is available on our website.

Botswana



Botswana NG13 / NG41

NG13: NG13 is one of Botswana's most remote and pristine hunting concessions, offering Graham Sales Safaris' clients a truly wild and authentic big-game experience. Situated in northern Ngamiland along the Namibian border, this 1,119 mi² unfenced wilderness forms part of a crucial transboundary wildlife corridor, ensuring consistent movement of big Elephant bulls, strong Buffalo herds, and naturally occurring Leopard populations. The area's rugged terrain, minimal human presence, and diverse habitats also support exceptional plains game opportunities. Managed under Botswana's community-based conservation framework and traditionally used by the Khwe San, NG13 reflects a balance of sustainable hunting and local stewardship - making it an outstanding destination for ethical, high-quality Elephant, Buffalo, Leopard, and plains game Safaris.

NG41: This beautiful concession is partially located in the well-known Mababe Depression, an area that was hunted by early explorer and adventurer William Cornwallis Harris during the late 1830's. It is located to the south of the Chobe National Park and to the east of the Moremi Game Reserve with the Khwai River flowing through the western part of the area. This concession is known for its beautiful Mopane woodland dotted with large rain filled depressions or pans. It is home to a diversity of both migratory and resident dangerous and plains game species. Elephants migrate on a seasonal basis through the area between the adjacent Okavango Delta and Chobe zone.

Mozambique

General information - Coutada de Marangira - Mozambique



Province: Niassa Province.

Location: Our operations cover 988,000 acres of unspoiled wilderness in the Niassa Province of north-western Mozambique. This area lies north of Marrupa and south of Block C - Niassa Reserve, bordered by the Ruambeze River to the east and the Lureco River to the west. The primary habitat consists of Miombo woodlands interspersed with open savannahs, seasonal wetlands, and riverine forests along numerous watercourses, rivers, and streams. The region features notable rock formations and mountains, many of which are cloaked in montane forest within narrow gullies ascending smooth rock faces. The impressive landscape, combined with the vastness of the territory, rich biodiversity, and undisturbed natural surroundings, establishes this location as one of Africa's truly remarkable wilderness areas.

Area size: 988,000 acres.

Rainy Season: Generally our rains are from November/December through to March.

Climate: 40°F (4°C) is the coldest it will get at night or early morning. (June / July) 110°F (43°C) is the warmest it will get if it is sunny and dry from October onwards. Typically, around 85°F (30°C).

Logistics:

Upon arrival at Johannesburg's OR Tambo International Airport via international flight, guests have two primary options for reaching the Safari camp:

- The preferred route involves taking a connecting flight from Johannesburg to Pemba. Guests may choose to spend the night in a sea-front guest house for rest before boarding a charter flight to the camp the following morning, or alternatively, proceed directly by charter flight to camp after clearing customs in Pemba. The airstrip is located approximately a 15-minute drive from the camp.
- Alternatively, guests can take a connecting flight from Johannesburg to Maputo, followed by another connecting flight to Lichinga. From Lichinga, the journey continues with a seven-hour drive to the Safari camp.

We also help at Pemba Airport, where our local representatives, Alex and Izaki, are available to support guests with customs procedures.



Visa & Passports: All foreign citizens need a visa to visit Mozambique. Visitors must have a passport that is valid for at least six months beyond their arrival date. The visa costs about US\$100.00. Currently, tourists can get a visa upon arrival at Pemba Airport.

Hunting season: The hunting season commences on 1 April and concludes on 30 November. The period from August through November is particularly advantageous, as much of the tall grass has been burned, giving way to fresh growth that attracts wildlife and significantly improves visibility. During these later months, although the region retains substantial water resources, some temporary watering holes and fountains have dried up, resulting in a higher concentration of game in the remaining areas.



Searching for Buffalo and Leopard tracks

Typical hunting day:

A typical hunting day begins with an early wake-up call. Guests are offered their preferred breakfast, and we depart camp prior to sunrise. For those who prefer not to eat early, a packed breakfast can be provided. If leopard is the primary target species, initial efforts focus on locating suitable bait animals and identifying optimal bait sites, while monitoring current bait placements. Once success is achieved with leopard, attention shifts to buffalo and other requested species. While priority is given to leopard, opportunities to harvest other trophy animals will not be disregarded if they arise. In cases where leopard is not the priority, tracking fresh buffalo or eland trails becomes the focus; most plains game is typically spotted from the hunting vehicle before planning a stalk, or by traversing open grasslands as circumstances dictate. Depending on target species, guests may spend several nights at fly camps.

- Shot distances for plains game generally range from 50 to 220 yards.
- Buffalo encounters average between 40 and 80 yards.
- Leopard shot distances usually fall between 50 and 90 yards, with blind placement relative to the bait being critical for success.

Each day includes a packed lunch, allowing time during midday to rest and dine in a shaded riverbed or similar area. Our vehicles are equipped with electric refrigerators stocked daily with bottled water and soft drinks. Afternoon hunting resumes after lunch, culminating with a return to camp following sunset due to the expansive territory covered. Upon arrival, guests can enjoy a hot shower, change into comfortable attire, and relax by the campfire before a warm dinner and restful sleep.

Taxidermist: Life Form Taxidermy.

Hunting license: In Mozambique, hunters are required to obtain a license before pursuing any game. We secure licenses for both dangerous and plains game species well in advance of the scheduled safari. Therefore, it is essential that we are informed ahead of time, or have a clear understanding, regarding which specific dangerous and plains game species each hunter intends to pursue.

Species available for hunting: Our Marangira region supports an impressive variety of wildlife, featuring Elephants, Cheetahs, the critically endangered African Wild Dog, as well as a thriving Lion, Leopard and Cape Buffalo population. Bushpig, Chobe Bushbuck, Northern Reedbuck, Crawshay's Zebra, Niassa Duiker, Livingstone's Eland, Lichtenstein's Hartebeest, Niassa Wildebeest, Roosevelt Sable, Spotted Hyena, Niassa Waterbuck, and abundant Warthog are also present. We take pride in offering one of the few areas where hunters can pursue several East African endemic species, including: Crawshay's Zebra, Niassa Wildebeest, Roosevelt Sable, Johnston's Impala, Lichtenstein's Hartebeest, and Chobe Bushbuck. "In my opinion, it is difficult to imagine another location in Southern Africa with larger populations of Leopard, Cape Buffalo, Roosevelt Sable, and Livingstone's Eland than this block." Overall, high game populations are closely linked to the outstanding trophy quality found here.



We operate two “fly” camps within our region, both of which are strategically situated along major river systems. During each safari, guests typically spend several nights in one of these camps. This approach allows us to remain near desired hunting locations for the subsequent days. Given the considerable size of the concession, it is crucial to maintain well-positioned “fly” camps throughout the area.
